AND NOW, this Eday of Other, 2022, upon consideration of the Complaint in Equity ("Complaint"), Motion for Special and/or Preliminary Injunction, and affidavits in support thereof, and it appearing that immediate and irreparable injury will result to the Plaintiffs PG Publishing, Inc., d/b/a Pittsburgh Post-Gazette ("Post-Gazette") and The Butler Eagle ("Butler Eagle") before a hearing can be held thereon unless defendants are enjoined and restrained as prayed, it is hereby ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED until further hearing and further Order of this Court that:

Defendants Pittsburgh Typographical Union #7 (CWA Local 14827); Pittsburgh 1. Newspaper Printing Pressmen/Paper Handlers Union #9 (Teamsters Local 24M/9N); Pittsburgh Mailers Union #22 (CWA LOCAL 14842); Newspaper, Newsprint, Magazine and Film Delivery Drivers, Helpers, and Handlers (Teamsters #205/211); Newspaper Guild of Pittsburgh Local #38061; Don McConnell, in his individual capacity and in his capacity as the Pittsburgh Typographical Union #7 (CWA Local 14827) President; Christopher V. Lang, in his individual capacity and in his capacity as the Pittsburgh Newspaper Printing Pressmen / Paper Handlers Union #9 (Teamsters Local 24M/9N) President; John A. Clark, Jr., in his individual capacity and in his capacity as the Pittsburgh Mailers Union # 22 (CWA Local 14842) President; Edward A. Boehm, in his individual capacity and in his capacity as the Newspaper, Newsprint, Magazine and Film Delivery Drivers, Helpers, and Handlers (Teamsters # 205/211) President; Zachary L. - b. Preventing or attempting to prevent by mass picketing, physical obstruction, violence, intimidation, coercion, threats or other means any person or vehicle from freely entering or leaving the Post-Gazette facilities and the Butler Eagle facility.
- c. Using any means to coerce, threaten or intimidate, or to attempt to coerce, threaten or intimidate any of the Post-Gazette's employees, agents and representatives, and/or others having a lawful right to do business with the Post-Gazette or to access or exit from the Post-Gazette facilities and the Butler Eagle facility.
- d. Preventing or attempting to prevent by mass picketing, physical obstruction, violence, intimidation, coercion, threats or other means deliveries and shipments made by or to the Post-Gazette at the Post Gazette facilities and the Butler Eagle facility, and/or any other location where the Post-Gazette conducts business or in transit.
- e. Mass picketing, physical obstruction, violence, intimidation or coercion, or threats thereof, directed towards the Post-Gazette's employees, agents, representatives, customers, vendors, suppliers or contractors at The Butler Eagle facility, or any location where the Post-Gazette conducts business, or in transit.

f. Stationing more than two pickets at any entrance, exit, entrance or exit ramp, or any other area of ingress to or egress from the Post Gazette facilities and the Butler Eagle facility, or permitting such pickets not to be in motion or less than 25 feet apart.

- g. Performing any act that would obstruct or interfere with the free use of roadways to or from or within any premises owned, leased or utilized by the Post-Gazette or the Butler Eagle or where the Companies conduct business.
- h. Encouraging or inducing others to engage in any of the aforesaid activities.
- 2. The Post-Gazette and Butler Eagle may serve true but uncertified copies of the Complaint, Motion for Special and/or Preliminary Injunction, and this Order upon each of the Defendants.
- 3. The Post-Gazette and Butler Eagle may serve additional true but uncertified copies of the Complaint, Motion for Special and/or Preliminary Injunction, and this Order upon any of the persons acting in concert with Defendants or otherwise participating with Defendants or acting in Defendants' aid or behalf.
- 4. Attorneys and agents for the Post-Gazette and Butler Eagle may serve copies of the Complaint, Motion for Special and/or Preliminary Injunction and this Order upon any of the Defendants and upon any persons acting in concert with them or otherwise participating with them or acting in their aid or behalf.
- 5. The Sheriff of Butler County and/or any duly-sworn law enforcement officer are hereby authorized and directed to enforce this Order without further Order of this Court.

Specifically, no additional Writ or Order of Enforcement need be issued before enforcement hereof. The Sheriff may assess such reasonable charges for such enforcement as are appropriate under law.
